Anglicare WA	Operation Drop Box	Anglicare WA will remove graffiti from approximately 30 drop boxes by repainting, rebranding and covering them with a graffiti-proof coating.	\$13,236
City of Canning	Clean Streets	The City will purchase graffiti removal kits for sensitive and bare brick surfaces and graffiti removal wipes. They will also run a public awareness campaign to raise awareness of graffiti reporting.	\$14,309
City of Gosnells	Industrial Area Graffiti Audits	The City of Gosnells will focus on commercial businesses located within industrial areas to report graffiti, take action to deter graffiti vandals and remove graffiti from their business premises.	\$20,000

City of Swan	Graffiti Reporting Upgrade	The City of Swan will update graffiti recording and reporting software and devices to ensure graffiti statistics are accurately recorded. They will purchase two new graffiti reporting devices with docking stations to enable graffiti information to be uploaded to the Goodbye Graffiti Database. Funding will also be used for a software upgrade from Digital Mapping Solutions.	\$16,510
Crime Stoppers WA	Youth Challenge	Crime Stoppers WA will develop and implement a Youth Challenge for school students to examine the issue of graffiti. The Youth Challenge will be a statewide competition for WA school students from year 6 to year 12.	\$19,600

Federation of Police and Community Youth Centres	Right to Write Graffiti Reduction	The Right to Write Graffiti Reduction program is a proven young offender program that targets youth who have been charged with graffiti offences. The program educates offenders about the consequences of graffiti vandalism and provides an opportunity for them to give back to their community.	\$19,788
Good Samaritan Industries	Graffiti Be Gone	Good Samaritan Industries will employ a specialist graffiti removal organisation to remove large scale graffiti from their donation bins. The use of a graffiti removal specialist will free up valuable resources to enable Good Samaritan Industries to focus on mission related activities for the people that they serve.	\$20,000
Spine & Limb Foundation	Graffiti-Proof Donation Bin Coating	The Spine and Limb Foundation (S&LF) will repair, repaint, rebrand and graffiti proof the donation bins. Work will be carried out by the S&LF at their facilities in Shenton Park and using Supported Employees (people with disabilities) to perform much of the sheet metal and repainting work.	\$20,000
Town of Victoria Park	Graffiti Removal Kits	The Town of Victoria Park will purchase and distribute 100 graffiti removal kits to businesses and the community located along the Albany Highway entertainment precinct. They will also be running a promotional campaign about the kits and encouraging all residents and community members to report graffiti to the relevant authorities.	\$8,565
