Shire of Murray	Safer, Cleaner Murray	The Shire of Murray will provide fridge flyers with emergency contact numbers and key reporting information to members of the community. Information will include details of the Goodbye Graffiti website and how to report graffiti incidents.	\$3,933
Town of Cambridge	Cambridge Solar Sensor Lighting	The Town of Cambridge will purchase and install solar sensor lighting, giving priority to residences that have laneway garages. Residents must have been a victim of graffiti vandalism to be eligible.	\$5,418
Town of Port Hedland	Graffiti Information System Graffiti Module	The Town of Port Hedland will install a graffiti recording and reporting system which utilises spatial data to report the locations of graffiti to enable them to accurately and effectively report graffiti incidents to WA Police.	\$20,000
Town of Victoria Park	Graffiti Summer Strategy	The Town of Victoria Park will purchase equipment including an electric bike and mobile field device, to enable graffiti removal officers to remove and report graffiti more effectively, while encouraging the public to report graffiti vandalism.	\$16,777
White Lion Incorporated	Bright Spaces for Bright Futures	White Lion will engage targeted at risk youth in a semi-structured arts based program. The program will involve art upskilling and educating young people about the impacts of their graffiti vandalism, completing a public art mural and celebrating and acknowledging the young people's contributions.	\$19,900
Youth Legal Service	Graffiti Diversion	Youth Legal Service will provide a multipronged approach to the management of graffiti offenders. A specialist child advocate will represent children and young people when they are the subject of graffiti charges along with providing a counselling service. Referrals to the team will be available to the Children's Court, Juvenile Justice Teams and the Magistrate's Court with the program educating participants about their responsibilities.	\$19,999
City of Kalgoorlie Boulder	Upgrade Graffiti Management and Reporting System and Graffiti Recording Devices	The City of Kalgoorlie Boulder will purchase and install software to upgrade the existing graffiti recording and reporting system as well as upgrading mobile field devices to enable them to accurately and effectively report graffiti incidents to WA Police.	\$17,518
City of Melville	Calling All Graffiti Vandals	The City of Melville will upgrade its' current mobile field devices for the reporting and recording of graffiti incidents along with the software and licensing for continued uploading of all data to the WA Police database.	\$18,394
City of Subiaco	Graffiti Management System Upgrade	The City of Subiaco will upgrade their current graffiti recording and reporting system along with updating mobile field devices to enable them to accurately and effectively report graffiti incidents to WA Police.	\$14,877
