



## Tips for taking photos of graffiti

When providing photos of graffiti to the Western Australia Police Force, it is important to provide photos that will assist with further investigation and possibly as evidence in court. Take a look at the tips below that may assist you with this.

- When taking photos of graffiti, ensure that you take a photo front on and the photo shows the vision of the entire mural or tag.
- If you are unable to take a photo of the entire mural take several photos so that they can be matched up to form the whole piece.
- A maximum of three photos can be uploaded to the Goodbye Graffiti database when making your graffiti report at [goodbyegrffiti.wa.gov.au](http://goodbyegrffiti.wa.gov.au); it is recommended that you upload photos containing different tags, and if you have taken more than three photos that you retain further photos in case of further police investigation.
- When making your graffiti report via the graffiti hotline on 1800 44 22 55 a maximum of four photos can be sent to [graffiti@police.wa.gov.au](mailto:graffiti@police.wa.gov.au). If you have taken more than four photos please retain them for further police investigation.
